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# THEME CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pre-grouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

#### **REVISED ORDERING GUIDELINES**

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a '**First Come, First Served**' automatedbasis.

To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: PayPal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

# All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition, i.e. not damaged or mounted, unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).


#### LEGEND

- $\boldsymbol{M}:$  indicates that the ticket has been mounted


**Back to travel tickets** now for an issue recently acquired. This is a black on white text single dated 11-04-1979 with a series of 13 for a single from **London Waterloo** to Guernsey or Jersey via Portsmouth (C.F.T.) Continental Ferry Terminal. It has audit codes of A6735 & 1001 with the shipping designation of Z. The fare has been applied in manuscript of £18.80. I wonder where this was actually issued, it was clearly a popular issue as per the series?


**Continuing with the Southern Railway** it is off to **HASTINGS** now and a first class single to Bexhill issued on 16-05-1971 with a serial of 3227. Now to the rural station of **HINTON ADMIRAL** (perhaps the name of a public house) and a First class privilege single to Christchurch in manuscript dated 04-06-1983 with a serial of 0089. I I had known about this one, a visit would have been paid to attempt to purchase a couple of these, as this is a pleasing ticket. Next to **HORLEY** and a third class government rate single to Sutton Coldfield in manuscript dated 24-02-1972 with a serial of 7001. Off to the boundary of Greater London and Kent for a privilege return from **KNOCKHOLT** to Grove Park or Shortlands dated 26-07-1974.and a serial of 0796. These dual destinations would have had the same fare, therefore it was prudent to feature both destinations rather than 2 seperate printings, also one less issue to have in stock regarding the ticket office. To West Sussex abd a privilege single from **LANCING** to Southwick dated 04-04-1972 with a serial of 1472. As the carriage works were located here a wide range of 'privs.' would have been in stock.


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
