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# THEME CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pre-grouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

#### **REVISED ORDERING GUIDELINES**

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a 'First Come, First Served' automated-basis.

To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: PayPal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition, i.e. not damaged or mounted, unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

A: indicates that the ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

**F**: indicates that the ticket is faded

**Our S.Rly. journey** takes us to the non-terminal part of Waterloo and a H.M.F. two coupon return from **WATER-LOO (E)**, East by the way, to London Bridge dated 07-02-1970 with a serial of 1415. Wonder what the need was for this specific pre-printed journey for military personnel on leave? Down the line to rural Kent now and **MARDEN** for a government rate single to Newark in manuscript. Dated 22-22-1973 with a serial of 1066. The next issue would have been pleasing for the purchaser as we feature both single and return First class privilege tickets from **MARTIN MILL** to Walmer in manuscript both dated 14-06-1976. The single has a serial of 072 whilst the return has a much higher serial of 0192. I believe that Martin Mill booking office acted as a post office as well, as post office date stamps have been seen on platform tickets from here. In view of this dual role officaldom was probaly practiced here and the staff may well have declined to issue these tickets without the correct authority, perhaps our friend Godfrey Croughton payed a visit here, as he was authorised to purchase first class 'privs'. Curious? Next to the London termini of **VICTO-RIA** and an issue issued in exchange for a day return issued by Southdown Motor Services Limited on payment of a supplementary charge of 6/6. the journey was from Victoria to Littlehampton, dated 22-06-1971 with a serial of 0017 and a hefty supplement of £1.15 which was quite a sum over 50 years ago. The issue is faded as you might well guess and would have been withdrawn not long after this. To conclude up to London by coach and return by train.
