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THEME CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pregrouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

ORDERING GUIDELINES

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a '**First Come, First Served**' automated basis. To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: Pay-Pal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).


LEGEND A: indicates ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

Continuing with our visit to the Plymouth area I will look through our severed halves and see what what interesting issues can be unearthed, for example, I know that something from Steer Point can be located, or even to it will be fine. This will all be covered in a seperate section. At Plymouth North Road a couple of L.S.W.Rly. issues are held and here they are. There is a single to TAVISTOCK issued in 1917, the rest of the date is illegible. The series is 8 with a fare of 1/4, a popular issue, I wonder if the GWR service to Tavistock also from this station was equally popular. The other issue is a single to CALLINGTON ROAD, dated 09-06-1905 which is series 1 and a fare of 1/10. The routing is via the P.D.& S.W.Junc. Rly. Of course, this station was not in Callington but well to the north of it in Stoke Climsland, which name has appeared on station name variations. This station lived out its existence with plain Callington. Now to Southern Railway days and a single to Devomport by 'Southern Railway Train Only. The fare was 2d and a serial of 9479. This station was renamed Kings Road by B.R. and closed in 1964. Have explored the route on foot and there are remains. When this route to St. Budeaux was proposed for closure there was an enguiry held in Truro, however no objectors turned up. Next a single to St. Budeaux which had the affix Victoria Road added in B.R. days. Our example is dated 03-11-1958, has a serial of 9881 and the routing is via Ford. This station is still open and the GWR line gained the Southern line by the use of a 1943 connection which of course is used now. Next a privilege single with a 'W' stamp (Female) to Bere Alston dated 17-04-1960 and a serial of 0276. There was a demand for this specific journey as per this pre-printed issue. Next a Southern Railway pre-printed single to Templecombe dated 27-11-1928 with negative numerals and a serial of 1199. Routing is via Ford. Moving onto GWR issues we hold a pre-printed single to Luxulyan dated 02-06-1958 with a serial of 159. I wonder if there was a specific 'slug' for this journey when multiprinters were introduced at Plymouth a couple of years later.
