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GENERAL CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pregrouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

ORDERING GUIDELINES

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a 'First Come, First Served' automated basis. To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: PayPal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

LEGEND A: indicates ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

G: indicates ticket is grubby or soiled **M:** indicates ticket has been mounted

More from Plymouth North Road and the Down Office: A child GWR single dated 15-03-1941 is held to Helston with a low serial of 037. Next a GWR bulk single in manuscript to Hugh Town (Scillies) dated 20-05-1952. Now we feature a B.R. (Railway Executive) 1st class Forces Duty Single to Newquay issued on 09-04-1958. A final issue from the Down Office now, which is a single to Ivybridge dated 09-02-1928 with a serial of 000. To the Up Office next and a GWR privilege single to Bittaford in manuscript dated 28-07-1926. Now a pre-printed destination of Edinburgh (L.N.E.) via London, and exclusive of conveyance between London termini. This has a low serial of 025 and the year of issue is illegible, however this has the feel of a 1930's issue. As this is a third class issue, one might have expected to see a higher serial, perhaps the 'normal' route then was via Bristol, Hereford and Shrewsbury and this was where a much higher serial was to be found. Next is a pre-gouping 'Article' ticket to the usual Penrith in manuscript and dated 19-06-1902. As an aside a large number of article tickets were found in a station loft at Penrith at some point featuring many railway companies. Moving onto a Sleeping Carriage ticket titled Penzance and Paddington, ours is dated 04-10-193? with a healthy serial of 3989. It has a '3' overprint to denote third class. Moving onto a punch ticket which is a receipt for excess fare, 'For Berth in Third Class Sleeping Carriage. This was issued Plymouth North Road, has a serial of 03799, is 'B' stock and the supplement charged was 10/1. Now to B.R. days and an early Morning two coupon return in grey to Whitchurch ('Down Platform' is added by us) dated 18-06-1957. We hold several B.R. tickets all with the destination in manuscript which have the audit codes of 7496/1, 3, 4 & 5. These are all dated in the 1960's. The station of origin is plain Plymouth, as Friary had closed by this time and Plymouth itself had multiprinters by this time. All of the tickets bar 4 are for Forces Duty Singles, with 5 being a privilege single. All are dated with a rubber stamp. Place of issue?,












