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THEME CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pregrouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

ORDERING GUIDELINES

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a 'First Come, First Served' automated basis. To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: Pay-Pal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

LEGEND A: indicates ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

C: indicates ticket is creased F: indicates ticket is faded

G: indicates ticket is grubby or soiled **M:** indicates ticket has been mounted

Back to Devonport now and a 2 coupon return from Albert Road to Dockyard Halt or Keyham dated 23-01-1965 with a serial of 4865. Now this station is plain Devonport and has long platforms which indicate its former glory. Another issue is a third class 2 coupon half day excursion from Albert Road to Shaugh Bridge Platform dated 30-08-1958 and with a serial of 1459. As mentioned earlier these halts on the Tavistock South line were popular destinations for Plymouthians who liked walking. Next is an undated Railway Executive Motor Cyle Parking issue with a serial of 090. I feel that this one was issued but not dated, as sometimes the staff would ask if you wanted the issue dated or not, as this example would have been popular with collectors, because it is a good example of a Railway Executive print. Next we visit Keyham not forgetting that as we go through Devonport tunnel, the disused 'Southern' tunnel is beneath us. We start with a GWR half day excursuion to St. Ives, dated 03-08-1958 with a serial of 877 which indicates a respectable usage for this day out. Next a GWR first class single to Devonport A.R. in manuscript dated 09-05-1964 with a serial of 232. This station was used a little by the Royal Navy as the HMS Drake barracks are nearby and our range of tickets from here will verify. In the meantime we hold another first class 'blank' from here, this time to Dockyard Halt with a serial of 248 and dated 21-05-1965. This tells us that 16 of these blanks were issued in a year, no doubt mostly if not all to collectors. Onto a Navy issue now and a pre-printed Government Agreed Rate single to Cardiff General dated 03-08-1950 with a serial of 035. Now a pre-printed Railway Executive Forces Duty Single to Birmingham New Street dated 15-12-1955 with a significant serial of 595. Routing is via Mangotsfield, which was quite different to the route used today. Another of the same title this time to Manchester London Road with the routing being a plain Bristol & Crewe. This issue is 2nd class, is dated 15-12-1962 and with a high serial of 1118 for this pre-printed journey. Next a preprinted third class Forces Duty Single to Dalmeny, dated in the late 1950's with a serial of 864.
