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## THEME CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pregrouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

#### **ORDERING GUIDELINES**

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a 'First Come, First Served' automated basis. To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: Pay-Pal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

**LEGEND** A: indicates ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

C: indicates ticket is creased F: indicates ticket is faded

G: indicates ticket is grubby or soiled M: indicates ticket has been mounted

Carrying on with KEYHAM, our single to Dalmeny is noteworthy as the main naval installation is on the north bank of the Firth of Forth, namely Rosyth, rather than on the south side as here. Now we move onto separate 'Down' & 'Up' issues from here, i.e. there was a booking on both sides of the line. We start with the only 'D' held, which is a Forces Leave manuscript single to Probus dated 02-11-1957 with a serial of 4193. Probus & Ladock platform was about to close by the way. Now to 'U' issues and a GWR first class two coupon to Devonport Albert Road in manuscript, dated 28-04-1962 and with a low serial of 018. Next a third class issue, which is a buff two coupon issue in manuscript to Marsh Mills, dated 04-10-1961 with a serial of 804. This was probaly the nearest station to which this facility was available. Now a GWR undated privilege blank to Goodrington with a serial of 192. This would have genuinely been used as booking office staff did not always date privilege tickets, they should have done of course, however.... Next an undated article ticket for a pram in manuscript to any station within six miles. This issue is clipped therefore should have been used. 2 blank Forces Leave Singles held are to Bickleigh with a serial of 5262 dated 16-10-195? and to Newport High Street, serial 5628 dated 01-12-195?. It is noteworthy that 366 of these were issued from this location in 6 weeks. The next station down the line is St.Budeaux G.W. (now Ferry Road) which has a limited service, however the nearby Victoria Road is still open. We hold a GWR punch ticket from here to Saltash and back which has a 'M' monthly overprint. This is stock A followed by the serial of 03122. We must not foget that the Tamar Road Bridge has not yet opened and the railway was an important alternative to the Saltash 'Steam Ferry' and also at a much higher level, i.e. no steep hills for pedestrians. Next is a GWR single to Keyham or Ford G.W. dated 09-08-1938 with a low serial of 188. Ford G.W. was closed in 1941 due to conflict damage, whilst the better known Southern Railway Ford which was nearby lasted until 1964. Some of the platform at Ford G.W. is still visible by the way.
