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## THEME CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pregrouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

### **ORDERING GUIDELINES**

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a 'First Come, First Served' automated basis. To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: Pay-Pal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

**LEGEND** A: indicates ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

C: indicates ticket is creased F: indicates ticket is faded

G: indicates ticket is grubby or soiled M: indicates ticket has been mounted

Today we wil look at the 'Southern' route north from Plymouth. First port of call is **DEVONPORT** which had Kings Road added in early B.R. days. This was a substantial station and became a through one to the north when a 'hole was created' at the northern end of the building. It closed in 1964 and was demolished in 1971 with a college of further education being constructed on the site. There are are remnants though which include a long metal footbridge over the site in the Plymouth direction as well as two approach roads in either direction from Kings Road down to the station site and up the other side. Ticket wise, we start with a London & South Western Railway bicycle single from Devonport to Luckett on the Callington branch in manuscript. It is dated 18-08-1913. Next is a single to Plymouth Mutley dated 11-04-1908 with a very high series of 105 and the fare is 1.5d. Usage was 'By South Western Train Only'. This is a good example of how the railways have come and gone in Plymouth. Next is a two coupon one day excursion audit to WEST-WARD HO. This is coloured light yellow with a white vertical band in the middle and routed via Ford, Bideford and the Bideford, Westward Ho & Appledore Railway. Our example has a serial of 001 with negative numerals so perhaps none of these were ever issued. The colour scheme is complimented with two thin red vertical strips and a red 'X' on the top half, i.e. the return portion. A most interesting ticket and a good one to have in a collection from here. Standard fare now and a Southern Railway green single to Bere Ferrers with a red child overprint dated 05-06-1963 with a serial of 0916. Next a H.M.Forces on leave single to Tavistock (renamed North in early B.R. days). It is dated 13-09-1950 and has a healthy serial of 7141 for this journey and facility. We should not forget that a large naval base is nearby, although I assume that most military business was from North Road but not all. Now to a two coupon issue and a cheap day to Okehampton dated 18-11-1961 with a serial of 1314, and of course with a routing via Ford, just to the north of Devonport. Another 1961 issue now and a first class day return to Plymouth in manuscript.


