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THEME CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pregrouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

ORDERING GUIDELINES

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a 'First Come, First Served' automated basis. To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: Pay-Pal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

LEGEND A: indicates ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

C: indicates ticket is creased F: indicates ticket is faded

G: indicates ticket is grubby or soiled **M:** indicates ticket has been mounted

Continuing with Devonport, we feature one further Southern Railway issue which is a faded two coupon first class privilege to Ford (Devon) in manuscript. It is dated 29-08-1964 complete with 3 clerks marks. Clearly bought by a collector it is pleasing even as described. Now we go to our B.R. Devonport Kings Road issues, of which two will be featured. One is a 3rd class single to Plymouth N.Rd dated 05-10-1957 with a serial of 8911 which suggests a more popular issue. The second example is a two coupon B.R. R.E. (W) child cheap day to Bere Alston, dated 21-10-196? with a serial of 734. The first couple of miles involved two tunnels, a very deep cutting between them, St.Levan viaduct (demolished 1987) and other cuttings. Now to Devonport and the water. We hold a L&SWR boat ticket from **DEVONPORT** (OCEAN QUAY) to Falmouth described as a Marine Excursion on board S.S. Victoria. The fare was 3/0 including Quay Tolls but 'exclusive of charge for landing'. The ticket is white card with two horizontal light yellow bands, is dated 09-06-1904 and a serial of 048. This issue is slightly grubby with a minor crease, but a great survivor. Now to a S.W.R. (South Western Railway) punch ticket single from Rail Motor Car 1 and a journey from plain **Ford** to our old friend Plymouth Mutley with a serial of 4. There is a LSWR self advert on the back extolling the virtues of the 'Express Route' from Waterloo and the South and West of England featuring Corridor, Luncheon and Dining-Car trains. Most interesting of all this type of punch ticket would have been issued by the guard from the nearby Camel's Head Halt (not open for long at all) as well as Albert Road Halt. Back to Ford and we hold 2 Southern Railway issues from Ford (Devon) the first being to St. Budeaux Victoria Road dated 15-12-1950 with a serial of 0867 and the second being an attractive first class single to plain St.Budeaux in manuscript, dated 15-08-1961 with a serial of 072. Next a B.R. (W) R.E. half day excursion return to Okehampton dated 28-06-1956 with a serial of 532. Finally from Ford (Devon) a child two coupon day excursion to Devonport (Kings Road) dated 15-08-1964 with a serial of 248.
