THEME CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pregrouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

ORDERING GUIDELINES

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a '**First Come, First Served**' automated basis. To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.


All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).


LEGEND A: indicates ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

Back to travel agency issues from Plymouth: We hold a GWR single from Plymouth North Rd 5 to Newton Abbot dated 16-05-1966 with a serial of 291. Now a much more interesting example which is a GWR green single from Plymouth M.B.6 to Paddington which is dated 15-02-1939 and a 8498 serial. This high serial is interesting as it is titled 'TRANSMIGRANT'. It is also inclusive of Dock Dues. Probaly the passenger arrived from the USA for example and when the vessel dropped anchor in Plymouth Sound, they would have been taken by 'tender' to the dockside at Millbay before transferring to a special train after customs formalities of course. All this ended in 1963 by the way. Moving onto B.R. days we hold a issue from A.102 which is a 3rd class single from Plymouth North Road to Hereford in manuscript. It is dated 27-05-1955 and is from agency ,A.102 followed by another single from A.102, except that this is 2nd class and is to Chippenham dated 15-06-1957 with a serial of 1361. A mystery location, rather like the next 9. Moving onto a 1966 issue from plain Plymouth to Exeter St. Davids, this one has an audit code of 6911. Next is a 19-06-1970 single from Plymouth to Paddington with a code of 7424. Onto 1974 now and a single to Exeter St. Davids from agency F.383, followed by an issue from the same agency to London Paddington dated 13-09-1974 and a significant serial of 2432. We hold an issue from F.389 to Paddington dated 31-10-1973 with a higher serial of 3714. Two are held from agency F.484 being first and second class singles respectively to Paddington. The first class issue is dated 30-10-1973 whilst the second class issue is dated 22-04-1976. A final couple this time from agency F.608 one being a second class single to Exeter St. Davids and the other a first class single to Paddington, this having a serial of 2861. I feel that these travel agencies were in Plymouth City Centre, as the station is some walk from the City Centre. I also think that these Edmondsons did not last much longer. No doubt the location of these agencies will come to light via the readership. Next time we will move on with some nautical issues, of which Plymouth had plenty.













