In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pregrouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

ORDERING GUIDELINES

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a 'First Come, First Served' automated basis. To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: Pay-Pal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

LEGEND A: indicates ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

C: indicates ticket is creased **F:** indicates ticket is faded

G: indicates ticket is grubby or soiled **M:** indicates ticket has been mounted

Continuing with the water theme we have a couple of interesting severed halves which are both undated and have company self adverisments on the backs, of course, only half of the 'Ad'. is available The first is one titled 'Saltash Three Towns and Dist. Steamboat Company Limited' and is for the return part of an excursion from Calstock to Promenade Pier, (Plymouth). The issue is white with a blue vertical band, has a serial of 7397 and has a series of 'A'. Now to an even longer title 'The Plymouth Piers, Pavilion and Saltash Three Towns Steamship Co. Ltd.' and the return half of an excursion from 'Yealm' to Plymouth. It depends on the tide how far up the River Yealm you can navigate, the same now as it was a hundred years ago, hence the destination name of Yealm. We have a serial of 8080 and series 'A' again. Wonder what the designation of 'A' stood for, perhaps there was a 'B' which defined another vessel?, or simply different stocks. I also suspect that the two companies were one and the same. The tickets printer was 'Williamson'. We move onto the Oreston & Turnchapel Steamboat Co. Ltd. which really did have a chequered history before finally expiring in 1965. We have a selection of roll tickets, starting with a 1d white issue and series 'Ka', price 1d. On the back there is a 'self' advert stating 'These steamboats can be hired for Pleasure Parties, Apply, H.Elford, Managing Director, Oreston, telephone Plymstock 17'. On the front: 'Passengers are requested to see 'THEIR' Tickets Torn from the Roll, and to produce them on demand 'OR' destroy them on leaving the boat. Issued subject to Reg'tions'. Thank goodness some survived. The next roll ticket is series W priced at 1d and on the back 'S.S. Countess of Morley' is featured as available to be hired. We have looked at these first two issues comprehensively as it gives the flavour and essence of the service in its earlier days. Our other five issues have blank backs, no doubt cheaper to print. The next issue is a 2d issue series B and is coloured light grey with a pink horizontal band and has had a little of the top right hand corner torn off, to act as a cancellation. We have a pink 3d, a green 4d, a white 5d & finally a 5d greenish issue. We have 3 from 'Plymouth Boat Cruises Ltd'.
