In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pregrouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

# **ORDERING GUIDELINES**

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a '**First Come, First Served**' automated basis. To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: PayPal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

# All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

LEGEND A: indicates ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

- C: indicates ticket is creased F: indicates ticket is faded
- G: indicates ticket is grubby or soiled M: indicates ticket has been mounted

A brief break from our Plymouth area severed halfs to feature a severed half from Edinburgh to Boat of Garten via Aviemore & the Strathspey Railway. The example is from Set D, and is a child issue with a serial of 0001 and dated 16-10-1980. Perhaps this useful facility was introduced in 1980, how long did it last?, I certainly have not come across an example before. Now it would cost a small fortune fare wise, plus a change at Aviemore. On the other hand a lot has changed in the last 45 years on the railway.

Back to the LSWR in Plymouth and an undated daily workman return half from Ford back to LIPSON VALE HALT (closed 1942) with a serial of 4564, therefore a popular issue. This was a GWR halt to the east of Plymouth. Next a S.Rly. return half from Bere Alston to Lipson Vale Halt pre-dated 30-06-1937 with a serial of 0015 and an audit code of 404. This was a special service arranged by the St. Augustine's Church Sunday School. Now to MUTLEY and a GWR return half of a child return from Devonport L.& S.W., parliamentary, dated 01-08-1899 with a serial of 1220. Interestingly 'child' appears twice once pre-printed and the other as an overprint. Next a return half from Elburton Cross to Mutley 'by Rail Motor Car' dated 22-01-1905 with a healthy serial of 1188. Now a couple back to Mutley from Clearbrook Halt and Clearbrook (Halt) dated 1932 and 1938 respectively. The first is a cheap return whilst the second is a 'certain trains only Evening', also with a 'E.C.' overprint. Now the outward half of a parliamentary to Yelverton dated 14-03-1900, with a serial of 8581. Next a return from Yelverton or Bickleigh, titled 'Walking Tour No.6' complete with a 'WT' overprint. it is dated 01-10-1907 (I think) which make it an early example of a Walking Tour issue. Now a Half Day Cheap Ticket parliamentary to Princetown dated 25-08-1898 with a serial of 9048. This area is of course, fine walking country and Mutley was a popular and well used station at one time and plenty of issues exist from it for which we are grateful.






