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THEME CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pregrouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

ORDERING GUIDELINES

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a 'First Come, First Served' automated basis. To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: Pay-Pal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

LEGEND A: indicates ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office


C: indicates ticket is creased **F:** indicates ticket is faded

G: indicates ticket is grubby or soiled **M:** indicates ticket has been mounted

Still with severed halves & Mutley we hold the return half of an 'Evening' cheap return from Princetown back to Mutley, dated 31-08-1938 with a serial of 1639 and of course the overprint in skeleton letters E.C. Also held is a privilege for the same journey issued in 1935, with a high serial of 2215. Clearly Princetown was a popular choice for railway workers and their families. Next a 'parliamentary' from Horrabridge back to Mutley dated 08-08-1898 coloured deep green with a red vertical band. The serial number is 2258. Now probally due to a lack of precise knowledge, the next issue is rather interesting. It is another GWR pre-grouping (P.G) issue from plain Tavistock back to Mutley, the date is unfortunately unclear, looks like 1886, but does does not fit as the routing is via LSWR Ford & Devonport which did not open as a through route until 1890, therefore we must go for 1896 or even 1906. Ticket is for a day trip coloured cream with a wide light red horizontal band and a narrow red vertical band. There is a small 2 which indicates an issue from the down office. The serial is 2914. Taking this route rather than the direct Marsh Mills route would have involved a change at Lydford. We will featuring several longer distance returns back to Mutley, so will see if more clues emerge about this indirect routing, Devonport and Ford was LSWR territory of course. Next another P.G. from Launceston back to Mutley via Yelverton, unfortunately the date is illegible. The colour scheme is green with same bands as the Tavistock example. Now a grey Workman's Return from St. Budeaux (renamed Victoria Road) back to Mutley via Southern Railway, Ford & Devonport clearly dated 04-02-1938 with a serial of 2050. I think that in 1938 there was a decent railmotor service from Ferry Road to Plympton and the 2 St. Budeaux's are very close, however the Southern route was specifically chosenhere. We have a GWR P.G. issue back from Bere Alston, date illegible again. However the next example is more interesting as it is a return half of an 'excursion' from Tintagel to Mutley. One returned on the Monday or Tuesday following date of issue. by 'Coach via Camelford' & Ford. It is dated 10-08-1901 and has a low serial of 021.


