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THEME CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pregrouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

ORDERING GUIDELINES

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a 'First Come, First Served' automated basis. To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: Pay-Pal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

LEGEND A: indicates ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

C: indicates ticket is creased **F:** indicates ticket is faded

G: indicates ticket is grubby or soiled **M:** indicates ticket has been mounted

Today we are travelling back to Mutley from Bude. Our severed half is dated 20-04-1906 and has a serial of 309. A similar issue is held back from Bideford, year of issue is unclear with a serial 219. Heading east now we have a pre-gouping issue back to Mutley from Plympton with an illegible date but a serial of 6475, S.00 indicating a popular issue. Next the outward half from Mutley to Wrangaton dated 27-07-1936 with a surprising serial of 5220. Returning to Mutley now from Moretonhampstead dated 04-06-190? with a serial 217. Finally the return half of a dog ticket, up to a distance of 15 miles, serial 3918. To conclude with this station, there was clearly much local traffic at one time and you could say that whilst Plymouth North Road dealt with the longer distance traffic, Mutley processed much of the shorter distance travel, although longer distances such as Bideford and Bude were catered for. If should be borne in mind that Mutley and North Road were very close and today the walk is no more than ten minutes. Presumably North Road also had pre-printed stock to Bideford and Bude even though Mutley was just half a mile away. Now to **Plymouth Millbay** which closed to passengers in 1941, following Mutley in 1939, the loss of these stations must have been keenly felt by local workers etc. We start with a pre-grouping return from Devonport back to Millbay from 190?. This would have used the westbound curve to gain access to the Cornish mainline. Piers of the viaduct on this curve remain with a metal sculpture on top of the piers. Now for a return 'parliamentary' journey from Brixton Road to Millbay, year of issue unclear and a serial of 3149. This must have been a popular destination for Plymouthians going for a day out. It would have been useful to know the year of issue but like most of our issues from Millbay, this information is at best unclear. We also have a return half from Yealmpton. Now for a similar facility from Yelverton with a much lower serial of 816. This one appears to be dated 189?. Next an outward to Newguay, dated 01-09-190? with a serial of 6119, a popular destination of course.






