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GENERAL CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pregrouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

ORDERING GUIDELINES

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a 'First Come, First Served' automated basis. To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: PayPal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

LEGEND A: indicates ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

C: indicates ticket is creased F: indicates ticket is faded

G: indicates ticket is grubby or soiled **M:** indicates ticket has been mounted

Today we will start to look at severed halves from **PLYMOUTH MILLBAY** and this station was well used by passengers as we will see as per the destinations served. This station was much more central than North Road. The station closed to passengers in 1941. Off we go with a pre-gouping return half from Plym Bridge Platform back to Millbay. The year of issue is illegible, a popular issue for Plymouthians as the serial is 8915. Plym Bridge Platform is now in use as the northern terminus of the Plym Valley Railway, an attractive location. Now to an 'Evening' ticket back to Millbay from Shaugh Bridge Platform (another beauty spot for walkers) dated 29-07-1938 with a serial of 4041. I really appreciate seeing dates as it helps to interpret the journey at that moment in time. We hold a similar issue featuring Yelverton dated 27-07-1933 with a serial of 7980 and series 13. Another example is held dated 29-07-1938 which is series 15. Therefore a popular issue with the travelling public which enabled them to have a day out from Plymouth with lots of fresh air. Still travelling back to Plymouth from Yelverton we hold a 'Special Return' issued by the 'Avenue Athletic Club' rubber date stamped 26-04-1936 with a serial 6540. Also stated 'Available for one person & one journey only'. There is a black overprint of 'S.L.'. An interesting issue. Now to a 'Cheap Return' buff issue from Princetown back to Millbay dated 09-08-1935 with a serial of 9127. Next a buff pre-grouping outward half from Millbay to Horrabridge dated apart from the year of issue which is mostly missing. Perhaps the year of issue was not that important for local trips, anyway there were clearly problems with the type and dating presses even in those dim and distant days. Our issue has a serial of 8107 not bad for an issue to this station, once again for walkers. One assumes that there would have been a reasonable level of business with passengers going TO Plymouth for the day. Another issue from Millbay and this time to Tavistock G.W. titled 'Commercial Traveller Day' dated 24-08-1937 with a low serial of 034, coloured buff. More next time.






